To help provide a framework to help us build these partnerships, we commenced working on the above award just over a year ago.


This provided a variety of tools, suggestions and ideas to develop.

Their hard work and effort was all worth it, with the money raised for Comic Relief being a Fulford Red Nose day record!




Our students also baked lots of fabulous cakes for the bake sale and took part in a students vs staff penalty shoot out at break in the gym.


Year 7 have had another great term at Fulford School. They have really settled in and are performing well in lessons as can be seen by the reports sent out on 22nd March.

behind each other to perform the opening to 'Bohemian Rhapsody' in sign language for the entire year group during an assembly, what a fantastic performance!


CHANGES EVERYTHING




The Year 9 Team have been very active over the last two months!




Year 10

Extended Project Qualification



This month we saw the culmination of the Extended Project Qualification for our Year 13 students, with formal presentations taking place in the main hall as part of the final assessment.

Sixteen students have chosen to undertake an Extended Project

Qualification alongside their A-levels this year - equivalent to half an A-level.

This involves research and production of a 5,000-word essay (or a product and a shorter essay), on a topic not covered by the student's A- Level curricula.

From a one-act play exploring grief, an essay on the use of generative AI in the diagnosis of breast cancer subtypes, or designing smart cities, the projects were an inspiration for all.

The EPQ is a fantastic bridge between A-level study and further study or the workplace, as it requires independence, a project plan and commitment. Some universities will offer a reduced grade offer to a student with an EPQ.

One of our former students who is reading History at Cambridge told us that, whilst the EPQ was not part of her offer, the interview panel were very interested in the fact that she had completed one.


MADHYAMAKA KADAMPA MEDITATION CENTRE



British Science Week 2025



British science started with an outreach visit to St Oswald's school on Wednesday 12th March.

Fulford's Senior Science Technician led eight sessions with students from Early Years to Year 4.



We discovered that there are more than five senses and made balancing robots and butterflies.

Early years students hunted for dinosaur bones, measured how long the biggest dinosaur was and found out how many of their footprints fit into a triceratops's.

Year 3 and 4 learnt about the code breakers at Bletchley Park and had a go and solving some spy codes themselves.

On Friday 14th March three groups of Year 5 and Year 6 students came from St Oswald's school to take part in some science week activities.

They were taught how to safely light a match and candle. Then using these skills some of them made a convection current snake and others investigated what happens when an empty teabag is lit.

It was their first experience of using the Science labs at Fulford school and hopefully there will be many more to come!




Exciting transformation of our Resource Centre
